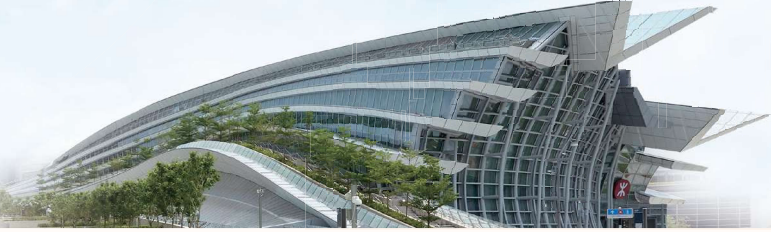


Uncover the hidden gems in Hong Kong West Kowloon Station!

Hong Kong West Kowloon Station is the gateway of High Speed Rail with many fascinating points of interest. Spanning about 11 hectares, the station offers a great view of the Victoria Harbour in addition to its unique architecture and beautiful landscape. 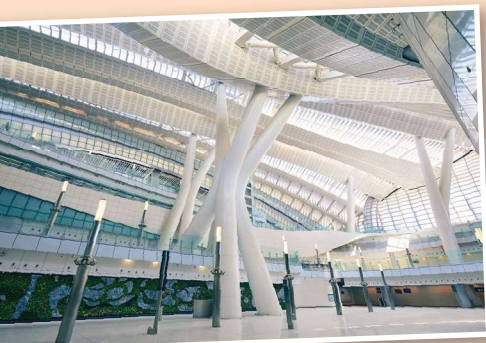
Architectural Design

The meticulous design of Hong Kong West Kowloon Station has been honoured with "The Best Public Building Project" in Leading European Architects Forum Awards 2019. In particular, the curved ceiling design and the use of glass panels help to introduce more natural light and make the station eco-friendlier. The shades of light have made the station a perfect spot for taking great pictures.

Hotspot 1:

Curved ceiling supported by massive columns

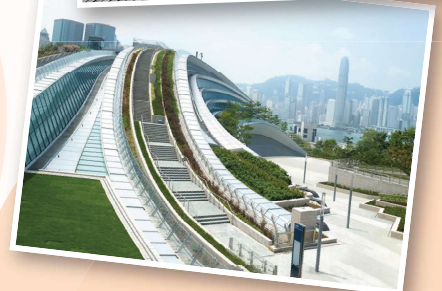
- The curved ceiling is made of over 8,000 tonnes of steel which is almost the weight of the Eiffel Tower.
- The spectacular structure of the station is supported by 9 sets of massive columns of different heights. The tallest one rises 45m in height from Level B3 up to the curved ceiling which became an iconic photo spot in the station.



Hotspot 2:

Giant curtain wall with irregular glass panels

- The giant curtain wall comprises over 4,000 irregular glass panels.
- The double-glazed glass panels bring in plenty of natural light, thus enhancing energy efficiency.



Hotspot 3:

Panoramic harbour view at Sky Corridor

- Enjoy the 270° stunning views of Victoria Harbour by walking along the Sky Corridor from outdoor area of Level G to the Observation Deck on the rooftop of the station.
- Elevator is also available in the station for accessing the Observation Deck.

Hotspot 4:

Green Plaza — the Urban Oasis

- Located near Entrance/Exit D, F and H at Level G
- Offer public greenery space for you to sit back and relax in the heart of the city.



Art in Station

Hong Kong West Kowloon Station Celebration Wall

Location: Level B2 – Arrival Concourse (near the gates)

The Celebration Wall comprises 3,315 photos of the High Speed Rail (Hong Kong Section) to commemorate its project completion.



Mountains & Rivers Without End

Artist: Wucius Wong; Hong Kong
Location: Level B2 – Arrival Concourse (near the gates)

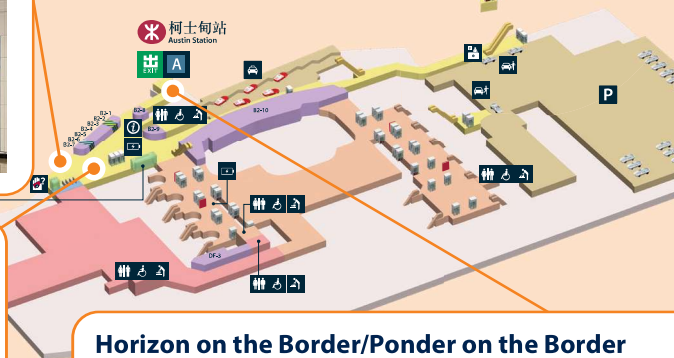
The clouds, lakes, streams, plains, plateaus, mountains, valleys and waterfalls are all created from the artist's mind. The work demonstrates that it is possible to build landscapes completely from memory, and highlights the fact that people construct their own worlds based on their cultural and historical bias.

The artist plays with the Kowloon landscape and culturally significant colour of red, using her abstraction to create a mural linking the station to Elements and the International Commerce Centre. Making for a powerful experience indoors for the viewer, the work can also be seen from outside the station, creating a visual delight in two different ways.



Horizon on the Border/Ponder on the Border

Location: Level B2 – near Entrance/Exit A

The artwork relating to Hong Kong's border is presented in two halves in the subways linking Hong Kong West Kowloon Station to Austin Station.

The artist took an unconventional approach to mapping Hong Kong's border by looking to the sea for the undrawn line on the horizon. In the first part, the artwork depicts an artificial continuous horizon line set horizontally in the sloping subway. In the second part of the artwork, the artist has recreated maps of all the islands he visited to take the photos. Linked by a horizontal line of text, each island is represented in three dimensions, with the contours of the island carefully carved from a solid block of stone.



Limited Time Photo Booths

Photo booths under the backdrop of colourful sunflowers in Shenzhen, romantic red leaves in Changsha and exciting indoor snow park in Guangzhou have been set up for visitors to create photo memories. You can also enjoy great fun by taking photos in the simulated driving cab of the Vibrant Express train!

Location: Level G – near Entrance/Exit F
